English

This term we will be writing:

- An adventure story based on the story 'The Mousehole Cat'.
- A setting description of a seaside scene.
- A non-chronological report about Whitby.
- A persuasive advert about the coast.
- Instructions on how to make a beach hut.

Maths

This term we will be covering the following topics: **Multiplication and division**

- Equal groups
- Using arrays
- Grouping and Sharing
- 2, 5 and 10 times tables and related division facts
- Odd and even numbers

Length, Height, Mass, Capacity and Temperature

- Measuring in cm, m, q, kg, ml, l and degrees
- Comparing and ordering

Fractions

- Equal and unequal parts
- Recognise and find ½, ¼, 1/3 and ¾
- Equivalence of ½ and 2/4
- Counting in fractions up to a whole

Science

Children will learn about the uses of everyday materials and how materials' properties make them suitable or unsuitable for specific purposes. They begin to explore how materials can be changed. Children will also learn about the growth of plants from seeds and bulbs. They observe the grown of plants first hand recording changes over time and identifying what plants need to grow and stay healthy.

Geography

This project teaching children about the physical and human features of coastal regions across the United Kingdom including a detailed exploration of the coastal town of Whitby in Yorkshire.

Design and Technology

This project teaches children about making and strengthening structures including different ways of joining materials. They will be using measuring, cutting and sticking skills to create their own beach hut.

Art and Design

Children will be learning about the visual elements of flowers including shape, texture, colour, pattern and form. They also will be exploring various artistic methods including drawing, print making, and 3D forms using paper and clay.

RE

Children will learn to explain what commitment means to them and to Muslims by knowing about how Muslims pray 5 times a day. Children will also learn to retell the Easter story and understand what Jesus' resurrection means for Christians.

PSHE

Children should understand the difference between right/wrong and fair/unfair and that actions have consequences. They should understand the importance of love, listening and sharing in relationships. Also, they should know how to get help for bullying and about the impact of teasing.

They should also understand how to respond to adults in a range of contexts, including online.

Music

Children will be learning 'I wanna be in a band'. Children will be learning about the genre of rock music. They will also be learning the song 'zootime' and will be learning about reggae music. They will Listen & Appraise other styles of music and continue to embed the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and playing.

Computing

Children will be able to open and send simple emails and know that there is an appropriate way to communicate with others online. As well as this, they will be able to define key search terms, navigate a web search results page and know premise of effective searching. They will also be able to use presentational software, making improvements based on feedback. They will be able to collect, organise and present data, adding images, tables.
