A guide to becoming a parent Governor.



Every school has a governing body made up of volunteers from the local area. One of the members of the governing body needs to be a parent of one of the children in the school.

What is the role of the Governing body?

The governing body has an important role;

- It acts as critical friend asking supportive and challenging questions.
- Oversees, with the Headteacher and the development of the school in order to ensure that children have the best education possible while they are at Earl Spencer Primary School.
- It has responsibilities for the school and makes plans for the future ensuring that decisions are followed through.
- The governing body works as a team, in partnership with the Headteacher and other agencies, to ensure there is a continuous improvement in the performance of the school.

What will I need to do as a Parent Governor?

As a parent governor you will;

- Attend the full governors meetings which are held once a term. (6 times a year)
- Most governors become members of a committee which also meets every half term to consider matters in more detail which they then take to the full governors meeting.
- You may be asked to come into school to carry out a governors visit which will involve meeting with staff for an agreed reason.
